Dear Friends,

It feels strange to maintain this kind of distance that we have had to practice recently, doesn't it? The coronavirus that started in a distant part of the world is now on our doorstep.

The Covid-19 virus has impacted every aspect of our daily lives. This includes church and worship, schools, weddings, buying groceries and even birth and death. How we gathered to celebrate birthdays and to grieve our dead has changed!

This all might feel strange and new to us but it is not the first time this kind of thing has ever happened.

I remember studying in seminary a lesson on how the Christian church managed through the time of the black death and plague. In fact, Martin Luther (the founder of the Reformation) wrote a letter to John Hess (a Reformed theologian) that was dated over five hundred years ago.

In that letter, he wrote about a deadly plague sweeping over the area where they lived. Composing that letter in a time of quarantine, Luther wrote this about his life and ministry to others.

"I shall ask God mercifully to protect us then. I shall fumigate and help purify the air and administer medicine and take it. I shall avoid places and persons where my presence is not needed in order to not become contaminated and thus inflict and pollute others and cause their death as a result of my negligence. If God should wish to take me, He will surely find me and I have done what He has expected of me. Therefore I am not responsible for my own death or the death of others. If my neighbor needs me, I shall not avoid place or person but will go freely as stated above. Such a God fearing faith is there because it is neither brash nor fool hardy and does not tempt God!"

Luther's thoughts are worth considering during these unusual days in our lives. I admit it is not easy to stay apart from one another. We are not made to isolate ourselves from one another. God has made us for relationships. We need each other. It is a sacrifice but it is worth it because of the social benefit for the care and health of one another.

As we celebrate Easter in one of the most surreal times ever, we still find the power of the resurrection giving the message of hope to a world that is seeking to find a Savior.

Much of that desperate cry is for an antidote or for a vaccine that will stop the spread of Covid-19.

For the Christian, it is an opportunity to rest assuredly in Jesus Christ.

In the book of Philippines, Paul writes, "...I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation...I can do everything through him who gives me strength." Philippians 4:10-13 The lessons taught here are based on contentment. The major lesson is whatever we face, whatever we have is based on what kind of relationship we have in Jesus Christ.

As these days of being in temporary isolation continue, I hope you are discovering what it means to trust and rest in Christ and find contentment! Christ is risen indeed!

- For those who have already registered and paid, we will refund the full payment if we are unable to have camps this summer.


- Check out our Facebook/Instagram page and our webpage. We will be sharing activities for campers and families during this time of social distancing.
