Missions UPDATE

Update from Chad and Dara Vanden Bosch December 2021

Dear Friends, As we have just celebrated Thanksgiving last week, we reflected on all that has happened over the past month-- we have much to be thankful for! At the top of this list is that, after nearly a 5-year wait, on September 24 we finally received Zinha's adoption certificate which means that she is now officially a Vanden Bosch! This has been such an incredibly long and difficult fight and even two months later it is almost hard to believe that it is over. We praise the Lord for completing on earth what we know was completed long ago in heaven. The completion of Zinha's (now officially

Luzia Joy Vanden Bosch) adoption set off a flurry of activity as we had to get/change birth registries and civil documents and all that fun stuff. Each one of those meant sitting for hours at government offices and fighting systems and personnel that are not used to dealing with adoptions. Praise the Lord in the end our perseverance paid off and we

now only need to get her passport, which we hope to do in the next couple of weeks.

During this time we also were able to get Julieta's birth registry and civil document complete which means that in October we finally had all the documents we needed to travel as a family of 5 outside of our province. We hadn't had a family vacation in nearly 5 years so we took advantage of our newly found freedom and were able to have a week at a beautiful beach about a 7-hour drive from our house. It was an amazing week of fun in the sun and sand and making amazing new memories as a family.

Many of you may now be wondering when we may be able to travel to the US for a much-needed furlough. That is still a very good question. Earlier this month we officially submitted the paperwork to begin the adoption of Julieta. We find ourselves still traumatized by the terrible experience we had with Zinha's adoption, but we have hope that Julieta's will go more quickly. Her adoption is being done at the district-level court (instead of the larger provincial-level court) with a different judge and prosecutor, so we pray that we will find favor and it will move along much more quickly. Our lawyer seems confident that we will even be able to petition the judge to give a court order to be able to travel with Julieta to the US before the adoption is complete. We hope that possibly in early 2022 we can make the long-awaited journey to the US as a family. Please pray with us as there are still many unknowns and hurdles that will need to be passed before that can happen.

Even with all of the excitement and extra activity in our family life, the ministries have also continued to move ahead. Despite continued restrictions due to the pandemic, small-scale audio Bible distributions have continued in many areas around the country. At one recent audio Bible distribution in the northern province of Nampula, RCA Global Mission does not receive denominational assessments or covenant shares. We depend on the faithful generosity of churches and individuals. our colleague reported that "So many people who received the audio Bibles were weeping with joy after hearing God's Word in their language for the very first time". The recording team has also been busy continuing to record the Old Testament in the Makua language from northern Mozambigue.

New Harvest Farm has seen some highs and lows over the past months. In October we had a great time spreading God's love through the distribution of high-quality seed to over 160 subsistence farming families in our area. There was great joy and excitement in the local community to receive such a blessing. In November we hit a low as we had to deal with theft from the small shop we have set up to help local farmers have access to quality inputs. Through the highs and the lows, we know that God is in control and we trust that he will use this farm to draw many people to Him.

The Compassionate Care team continues to make their palliative care visits. It's been a real blessing to be able to distribute things that came in the container. We have been able to generously give blankets, hats, and feminine hygiene packs to our patients, their families, and the community. There have been some really difficult cases we've been involved in this year. I'd like to ask you to pray for our friend and patient Fernando who we've been working with for 1 1/2+ years to heal a wound on his leg. It's coming but it is discouraging that it's taking as long as it is. I think I can honestly say that our entire compassionate care team is looking forward to our scheduled two weeks off over Christmas. But, before that we'll have the privilege of giving out Christmas parcels to our 15 palliative care patients—that is always a highlight of the year.

As we all push towards the end of the year we want to thank you all for your prayers, love, and support. We're getting closer to being able to plan a trip back to the US. Please will you also pray that travel restrictions do not limit us when the time comes and we are ready to go to the U.S. As of now there are very few COVID cases in Mozambique and we feel very safe and COVID has limited effect on our lives.

We hope you all had a special holiday celebrating Thanksgiving with your friends and family. God Bless you, Chad, Dara, Nede, Luzia and Julieta
