

Dear Friends,

Last month, two meetings were held after our worship services that shared why our church (First Reformed) is on the road to leave the Reformed Church in America.

This is a decision that is historical as our roots go down deep into this denomination.

The meetings we held were very well attended and good questions were asked.

I want to put in print as a reminder of how we got to this point before all the details of where we are going and how we are planning to leave the denomination become the prominent focus of our attention!

The issues: There are two. The authority of scripture and a traditional view of marriage.

The authority of scripture: We believe the Bible is the inspired Word of God and the final authority in all things is the Bible.

The traditional view of marriage. We believe marriage is between one man and one woman.

The result: These two statements are brought together when we believe that the Bible does not bless same sex marriages!

The frustration in keeping this as our (The RCA) official proclamation as a denomination goes back at least forty years. As the years have gone by, some Classis (groups of churches) have allowed same sex marriage between their pastors and also allowed their pastors to perform same sex marriages.

What once was done behind "closed doors" has become a "in your face I dare you attitude" when it comes to a denominational stand on marriage!

The Catch 22—the way we govern ourselves as a denomination has resulted in a stalemate. One "side" cannot get the majority of votes needed for discipline because of this issue.

The time is now! After years of this, a movement has been born of conservative Reformed Churches. There has been no desire or pleasure in leaving our denomination but it is felt the Bible has to be obeyed and we cannot do this faithfully by sharing an official view of the RCA today!

Where are we going and how? Many details need to be worked out but we look to join a newly formed group of Reformed Churches called ARC or Alliance of Reformed Churches. This will be done by issuing a letter of intent to leave the denomination and then a petition to leave.

When will this happen? The process could begin this fall and continue through next year. Along the way, there will be Classis and denominational meetings that will clarify our position in this journey!

The destination—I believe that in the end where "we land", will give us the opportunity to be more effective in proclaiming the good news of Jesus Christ and obedience to scripture.

I would like to close with this verse from Psalm 37:5, "Commit everything you do to the Lord. Trust him and he will help you...the justice of your cause will shine like the noonday sun."

Stay tuned for details as we make this journey together!




VBS 2021 Offering: This year we will be collecting food and baby items to donate to local food pantries to help families in our local area.
