Informational Update to Sully First Reformed Church congregation From the Next Step Transitional Team

Our Consistory has set up a Next Step Transitional Team, consisting of members: Craig Maasdam (chairman), Ervin Arkema, Arloa Harthoorn, Ryan Mortvedt, Gary Van Genderen, and Eloise Vos. Interim Pastor Tom VandeBerg is also participating in the team's meetings. The purpose of this team is to investigate denomination options for the future of our church here in Sully. Our church is a member of the (RCA) Reformed Church in America denomination. While the official standing and policies of our denomination have remained in line with our local church's beliefs and practices, the denomination has failed to enforce their stance on various issues, particularly with regard to issues relating to human sexuality, i.e. same sex "marriage". This has resulted in a deep division in our denomination. Many churches are leaving the Reformed Church in America denomination or making plans to do so.

The Next Step Transitional Team will evaluate potential denominations for our church to join. A recommendation will be made to the consistory. If the Consistory votes in favor of a change, a special Congregational Meeting will be held and 75% of the Congregation will be required to vote in favor of leaving the Reformed Church in America denomination and in favor of joining another denomination. If the outcome of the vote is to change denominations, the Next Step Transitional Team would then be in charge of preparing the numerous official documents to leave the denomination.

As of today, the Next Step Transitional Team has met with representatives of five different denominations, the Alliance of Reformed Churches (ARC), the Evangelical Free Church of America (EFCA), the Sending Network (a new denomination based out of Third Reformed church of Pella, IA), and the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA). Consistory members have also been invited to come to these informational meetings. This past Monday the team met with the Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC).

The Next Step Transitional Team is researching various organizations that fit us theologically and missionally since the Reformed church in America no longer does.

Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC)

On Monday, March 7 the Transition team with the elders and deacons met with two members of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC). This Presbyterian Denomination was established 41 years ago, when it broke away from the Presbyterian Church USA. Great Lakes & Rivers Presbytery which includes Iowa, Illinois, Wisconsin & Minnesota, and is a group of 31 Churches. The Great Lakes and Rivers presbytery would be like our classis. As a presbytery they meet 3 times a year and The General Assembly which is the top level of governance meets once a year in June and there are 630 total churches in the EPC. Each church has its own ministers and two elders who represents them and votes at the General & Regional meetings. As a denomination churches are asked to meet a \$23 per member amount for the general level and \$17 per member for the regional level. These assessment amounts are not mandatory it is voluntary. In the future they are looking at changing this to a percentage figure of church income. If FRC of Sully would join the EPC we could retain our name, and our property would stay with us, and also as a church we would be more autonomous than we are now.

At the church level the Elders and pastor are called a session. Elders have the voting rights, deacons are in charge of making the financial decisions & mission decisions but major decisions require a vote from the elders. The minister votes to break a tie in the session. Both men & women are eligible to serve in all areas as teachers, deacons, elders, ministers both ordained and commissioned. The churches elders are responsible for appointing elders to represent the church in meetings both presbytery and general assembly's just like we do with our classis. Baptism in the EPC is the same as we are now, both infant and adult are done. The Lord's Supper is also done the same way as we do. EPC primary confession is the Westminster. They also recognize the Apostles Creed and the Nicaean Creed. Currently the EPC has no seminaries but do require their ministers to have a seminary degree to be ordained. Each minister is given a board exam and vetting by the Presbytery before they can minister in the church they have been called to serve. The EPC has a health and retirement program for the ministers who are serving in the EPC.

The most important thing of the EPC is their strong theology on the understanding that the Word has not changed and is the same now as it was when it was inspired. The Bible is to be taken "as written" and not interpreted to meet today's culture as we see fit. They believe strongly marriage is between one man and one woman. They also stand strongly against abortion. Recently they were making some change to their BCO regarding LGBTQ and their stance was unanimous against when they took a vote. Not a single no vote. This shows there's strength and unity. They look at each other in their local church, their presbytery and the General assembly all as one big family living in unity. The EPC has a very good disciplinary program for ministers, church leaders and the local churches as a whole. The EPC is very unified in their membership and leadership. It is a very unified denomination.
