5 WAYS TO

GROW GRATEFUL KIDS

Gratitude is our response of thankfulness for God's goodness, love, provision, and grace.

As Christ-followers, we don't just practice gratitude because it's good for our health (although it is!), or only when things go smoothly. Our gratitude flows from an awareness that, regardless of our circumstance, God loves us and is with us. Here are five tips for cultivating grateful living with your family.

1 EXPRESS YOURSELF

Express your gratefulness to God and to others (including your kids!) out loud and often. They're taking their cues from you, and the best way to cultivate a grateful spirit in your kids is to cultivate it in yourself too.

PROVIDE PROMPTS

At mealtime, at bedtime prayers, and at other times, invite everyone to name a person/place/ thing/experience for which they are grateful, or to name something they can hear/see/taste/touch/ smell for which they are grateful.

3 TAKE NOTE OF GOD'S GIFTS

Keep track of God's good gifts using a format that works for your family. Some ideas: keep a family gratitude journal; jot your thoughts on sticky notes and post them on a Gratitude Wall; express your thankfulness on paper strips placed in a Gratitude Jar; write or draw things for which you are grateful on a paper tablecloth. Save your lists and drawings and revisit them at Thanksgiving, on New Year's Day, or anytime you'd like a reminder of God's provision.

4 REMEMBER GOD'S GOODNESS

During challenging circumstances, remind your kids that God is with them. Wonder about the ways in which God may be at work behind the scenes. Express gratitude for the fact that even though we may not fully understand God's plan, we can trust that God works for good in all situations and that our destiny is safe in his hands.

5 LIVE GRATEFULLY

Your practices should overflow into your community. Be generous with your time, talents, and resources. Show appreciation to others in tangible ways. Be a servant. And always try to treat others in ways for which they can be grateful and give thanks to God!



Sunday School Project 2020

The entire **Sunday School department** has a goal to raise **\$4,000** for a special Christmas offering for Chad & Dara Vanden Bosch, RCA Missionaries in Mozambique, Africa. The offering for this project will begin Sunday, November 1 and conclude Sunday, December 13.

New Harvest Farm, launched in 2018 by RCA missionaries Chad and Dara Vanden Bosch, seeks to bring change by helping small-scale farmers increase their yields and produce better food for their families. The 25-acre experiential learning center offers hands-on agricultural training specific to the region and weaves the gospel into each training session. "It is our hope that not only will the farmers learn some techniques to increase their yields and profits, but that we would also be able to build relationships that will till the soil of their hearts to receive the gospel [so that] there will be a new harvest of souls," says Chad.

One of the immediate challenges that we are facing at the farm is in the area of operating expenses. The major infrastructure projects we are working on are transforming the farm, but are also needing lots of man hours to complete. We would love to push over the next 2 months to finish up these infrastructure projects so that we are ready for the next agricultural campaign to start in November. We are looking to raise \$4000 to cover these costs over the next three months. More can be found at the website listed below:

I know Pastor Wayne has mentioned it before but on behalf of the Deacons we want to Thank the congregation for your continual support and giving. In the past the Church was given a generous gift from the estate of one of our members with the intention to use for mission work at our discretion.

The Deacons decided to set aside \$12,500 to be used in a reverse offering.

I have heard that this makes some people uncomfortable trying to figure out who or what they should give this to. I look at this as an opportunity to discuss with your family and see if they know of someone or a worthy cause.

We know that this year has affected everyone in some way. This also could be used as an opportunity to help someone that does not know Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

There will be 1 envelope per family with 3 ways to receive this reverse offering.

15.

- 2. Another way is to pick your envelope up at the church office.
- 3. If either one of these ways does not work, contact an Elder or Deacon to deliver your envelope to

you.

An envelope not picked up or distributed after 2 weeks will be put back into the Mission fund.

With all the blessings this church has been given we feel the congregational members will be able to outreach to people that we as Deacons may not know are in need. Thank you!

Our Reverse offering will take place on Sunday, November 15, 2020!

What is it? The deacons have set aside \$12,500 whereby our members will receive \$50 per family or single member to use in any way you want towards a worthy cause.

How did this come about? In 2017, we also had a successful reverse offering. The blessings were enormous and the Lord blessed the giver and the receiver of these gifts.

We always wanted to do this reverse offering again. This offering was enabled by a gift from an estate from one of our members to be used for missions without any restrictions.

How will it be distributed? On Sunday morning, November 15 the deacons will be at every door after the morning worship, handing an envelope to each family. Another way to receive your envelope is to stop by the church office. If either one of these ways doesn't work you may contact an elder or deacon and they will deliver one to you. Any envelope not picked up after 2 weeks will be put back in the Mission fund.

Consider sharing your story via email or letter on where you blessed others! If you could return your Blessing story by December 13 to the church office, that would be great. You may do so anonymously if you want!

God has blessed us richly and in the world of COVID-19 we can be his ambassadors of hope in so many ways!
