"I am with you and will keep you in all places" my five year old daughter told me was the reason she wasn't afraid at night any longer. She went on to explain this was the Bible verse her Sunday School class was memorizing. Before this conversation, I had been thinking memorizing Bible verses wasn't that necessary. My small child taught me differently.

There have been many times when this verse seemed to explain occurrences in my life. There was the time I lost control of the car on a gravel road. I was headed in to town to the laundromat with my younger sister and two neighbor girls. I was driving faster than I should have been when I hit the loose gravel. The car swerved from side to side all of a sudden I felt the steering wheel jerked out of my hands which spun the car around landing us in the ditch headed back towards home. The youngest in the car was yelling "I'm okay!", I'm okay!" I'm praying, "Thank you, Lord!" There were so many very deep ditches we would have landed in if that accident had happened near one of them. I am still so thankful for what didn't happen!

The move to Sully brings to mind another incident where this verse seems applicable. Our home in

Marshalltown sold quicker than expected. Warren was working the summer for Lynks Seed Corn as the coordinator for detasseling crews. We decided I and the girls would move early to Sully. We rented an older house in Sully until our home was ready for us. This meant Warren would be gone during the week and with us on the weekends. It felt a little lonely with no close friends to rely on. Warren's family helped but it wasn't quite the same closeness. There came the day we had church friends from Marshalltown stop in for a visit and with children Jenny and Amy's ages. Later that same day two college friends stopped on their way home just to reconnect and reminisce. As the day quieted down into evening I received a call from a high school classmate who was passing the Sully exit, didn't have time to stop, but wanted to say "Hi!" I felt at peace and assured that Sully friendships would soon follow!

"I am with you and will keep you in all places." Genesis 28:15, whether life and death times or in everyday ordinary times. We can depend on it!




