# "What People Didn't See"

On August 10, a fierce straight line wind, which we later learned was called a derecho, bore down on much of central and eastern lowa. Widespread damage was inflicted to crops (especially corn) in our area and to trees.

After looking at the devastation of some trees in Grinnell, I was reminded of a tree that had fallen by our home where we once had lived.

It told a story. Let me share it with you.

One year a large section of a tree fell not far from where our house stood. We had lived there for over fifteen years and the tree had become something like an old friend. Within minutes of crashing down several of my family and a few neighbors came to look at the gaping hole left by the fallen tree. As I stood there, the thought struck me, this happened only minutes ago but its been in the process of happening a long time ago. No tree just suddenly breaks apart. Once we were able to see beneath the thick bark where it had cracked off, it was obvious that a decay and rot of a killer disease had been at work for years!

Soon a group of neighbors came with their trucks, chainsaws, rakes and brooms and had everything cleaned up in no time.

I compared this with some of the lives I've seen seemingly suddenly broken and fallen in life.

Unlike trees, people don't grow up all alone or exist in a world of stoic independence. We mingle and merge into one another's lives. All the while there is appropriate respect for each other and for one another's privacy. So we back off, trusting one another in a surface veneer where the things of life that really matter seem too personal to share.

But here lies the problem. A core disease in a life goes unnoticed and untreated. No one knows that the pulp behind the healthy looking bark is neither wholesome or healthy. And so the erosion of hurt continues its slow silent, secret process. And one day there comes that sudden collapse—a suicide, a divorce, an addiction revealed, a lie, a false friendship, misplaced priorities— you name the hurt, but it is a terrible break that allows everyone to see what no one expected. But because fallen people are not like fallen trees, many around the fallen one are always injured and the cleanup is never efficient. There is no clean up crew that can remove all the evidence and sweep away all the debris, so the scar of the damage lingers.

This month we celebrate World Wide Communion in the midst of a pandemic called COVID-19. The world is thirsty for hope and good news.

This week I spoke with an individual who summed their experience of life thus far, "I'm tired of hard."

As Christians, we have the answer to that statement and the future we face.

We are called to Remember! "This do in remembrance of me," Jesus said to his disciples as he broke bread with them. He calls us to remember we are not alone! He calls us to remember He is Risen.

His was a journey of brokenness and healing where Jesus came to clean up lies, heal the hurt, give hope to the brokenhearted and to give life to those who were destined to die! He does that for us today!

Jesus later asked Peter, "Do you love me?" Jesus' question cut to the heart of Peter's problem and ours as well because it reveals an inner soul that needs to be healed!

How do you respond to that same question today? The answer will set you free! Yes Lord, you know that I love you!


3 yr. olds -Kdg. are able to participate in Children in Worship during the morning worship service. The first week they talked about "The Light" and are learning the Ten Commandments.

our life routines, we as Christians need to let our



God picks you from the patch and brings you in. (John 15:16) Then He washes all the dirt off of you. (2 Corinthians 5:17)



The click of an unlocked door marks the beginning of another busy day at Fără Limite Climbing Gym in Vulcan, Romania. Chalk instantly covers hands, and clouds of chalk dust fill the air. Music blasts as kids scale the walls for the next seven hours. Cheers of encouragement and warm embraces provide a glimpse into the family they've built here, a stark contrast to many of the kids' lives outside the gym walls.

In partnership with the New Horizons Foundation, Felipe and Janelle work with Roma youth in the Jiu Valley to build trust, perseverance, character, and courage through rock climbing. In a town where poverty forces many parents to move away for work, this ministry provides youth an environment where they can experience safety and respect, develop life skills, pursue education, and come to know the love of Christ. Felipe and Janelle are also planting a church in the community of Dallas.
