

In trusting that the Lord will sustain us through any circumstance, we watch the rain and the strong storms come. Or like we all experienced this summer, week upon week of hot and dry weather. We all go through times where the storms of life won't quit. We have weeks upon weeks of feeling dry spiritually and distant from God. But we know that these storms produce trust and faith while the dry spells create stronger, deeper spiritual roots. We are also reassured that this season doesn't last. Time presses on toward the next season.

Fall can be a season of uncertainty. Will my crop be enough to cover my expenses? Will I have a costly break down? All we are asked to do is trust. "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in Him." Jeremiah 17:7 After all, God is the one who has it all in His hands. Harvest can also be a season of great celebration, blessing and thankfulness. May our hearts remain thankful as Paul instructs us in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." And perhaps this is the season spiritually where God blesses you and you see the fruits of abiding in Him! What a beautiful season it can be!

The season of winter is one of my favorites. It represents rest and renewal for me and my family. The cold, ice and snow gives this season a bad rap. However, like all the other seasons, it is necessary. Following your harvest season, you can be assured that you will find rest in the Lord. You will be prepared, renewed and readied for what is next. One of my wife's favorite verses sums it up best, "Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty." Psalm 91:1

Thank God for every season, for they all have a purpose. Whichever season you are in, thank God for it. Rest in the hope and assurance that the seasons change and God is in control!



STARS Wednesday After School Program for Kindergarten-5th Grade began a new year on September 7.

Bible lessons this year are from the book The Big Picture Interactive: Bible Stories in 5 Minutes, published by B&H Publishing

Group. Each week, 30 minutes are spent on the



Bible lesson, 10 minutes on Bible memory work, and 40 minutes on a learning activity.




